I am writing to express my unequivocal and strong support for Kristen Taylor as a Full-Time Tenured Faculty Member in the Biology Department at Salt Lake Community College. I understand that she is being reviewed by her Sitting Committee for another Letter of Progress and for the awarding of Tenure. She absolutely should receive BOTH. Over the years, I have served as Kristen's teacher, laboratory/research mentor, co-author, chair and now her colleague. It is my observation that Kristen is an accomplished scientist, a model biology teacher and an even better faculty member.

Kristen is well known among the circles of scientists who study marine mammals and their sensory perception mechanisms. Her research on the auditory systems of these fine creatures comprises a body of important scientific knowledge that helps with conservation efforts and furthers our understanding. Of particular importance, her research perfectly complements her teaching duties at SLCC. Kristen serves on numerous committees and has been a faculty senator for several years. I can't think of any faculty member in our department that serves on more college wide and school wide committees. Kristen is always available to help with important tasks that come up from time to time. I, personally feel that she has become a great example of what a good faculty member should be.

In summary, I find Kristen Taylor to be a gifted scientist, a wonderful educator and an invaluable member of our department faculty. I recommend that Kristen be given a Letter of Progress and that she be awarded a well-deserved permanent Tenure. I do so as strongly as I possibly can.
